

Quincy Public Schools Fall Update #2 September 24, 2021

Dear Quincy Public Schools Students, Parents, Guardians, and Staff,

This past week, many of our schools held Back to School Open House events. Thanks to our principals, assistant principals, teachers, student support staff, paraprofessionals, office staff, custodians, and everyone who collaborated on welcoming students and their families in person. It was wonderful to hear the positive comments from families who appreciated seeing the classrooms and meeting the teachers in person.

This past week was also the first full week of the Quincy Public Schools COVID-19 Pooled Testing at all school sites. Just under 1,200 staff members and students were tested over four days, Monday through Thursday, with the results reported the next day. Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes:

SMS stands for Short Message Service and is commonly referred to as a "text message". Most cell phones support this type of text messaging. Our notification provider, SchoolMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers. If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Your child has seen a demonstration of the following instruments at his or her school:

Flute Clarinet Saxophone Trumpet Trombone Euphonium Percussion Horn* Oboe**

We hope that you will discuss the possibility of playing one of these instruments in the school band this year and consider the type of instrument your child would like to play. To ensure that we have a successful and safe return to in person band, we will be taking extra precautions including: using bell covers and spacing students the maximum possible distance.

It is the parent's responsibility to rent or obtain an instrument. To make this process easier, we will be hosting an **Instrument Rental Night.** This will take place on **Monday, September 27th** at **6:00pm** at **Quincy High School** in the auditorium and cafeteria with the K&C Music Company. It is important that you arrive promptly at 6:00 for an informational session regarding the rental of your child's instrument. After this meeting, you will pick up your child's instrument, book, music stand, and any other necessary accessories. We encourage you to place your instrument rental order online at: <u>www.kandcmusic.com</u> if possible. Those families who are not able to place an order online may rent in person at the rental night. Please see the back of this form for more information on renting online. If you cannot attend the instrument rental night, you can contact the K & C Music Company directly at (781) 769-6520.

Initially it is better to rent an instrument until the child's ability and interest are established. We recommend this plan as it protects the parents from an expensive purchase until the child *can* and *will* play. Moreover, it is also important not to be lured by inexpensive instruments for sale on the internet or at other discount stores; these instruments are not of the quality your child deserves and will likely impede his or her progress. Renting an instrument is therefore an affordable, reliable, and convenient way for your child to have fun making music. The average monthly cost is about \$30-\$50, depending on the instrument. If you already have your own instrument, we encourage you to have it inspected on rental night to be sure that it is in good playing condition. If needed, the K & C Music Company has complete repair facilities available to you.

Band lessons will begin on Tuesday, September 28th. Because the first several weeks of learning an instrument are the most crucial, please be sure your child brings their instrument on the first day of band.

*If your child chooses to play **horn**, they are required to take private lessons with a horn specialist outside of school. The fee for lessons will depend on the private teacher. Please see your band teacher for more information.

If your child chooses to play **oboe, they are required to take private lessons, which will be arranged with Mrs. Hagborg for no additional fee.




4C Trees Needs You!
