

Quincy Public Schools Fall Update #3 November 19, 2021



Dear Quincy Public Schools Students, Parents, Guardians, and Staff,

Over the past two weeks we have heard from many students, staff members, families, and community members expressing concerns of systemic racism, discrimination, and climate and culture issues within Quincy Public Schools. Some of these concerns were shared at school-based student forums and remote and in-person parent forums that included restorative circles both with our students and our families. This week, we also met with the Quincy High School student Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion group, Citywide Parent Council Equity, Diversity & Inclusion representatives, and have held multiple staff meetings at school sites.

Throughout all of these meetings, consistent topics for areas of improvement have emerged:

- revising and updating the student handbook;
- curriculum revisions and updates that create opportunities for all students to see themselves within the curriculum;
- implementing culturally responsive teaching practices in all of our classrooms;
- learning about and celebrating our diverse cultures within the district;
- establishing student mentor initiatives; and
- the diversification of staff to better reflect the student population.

We recognize that there is much work to be done and identifying these priorities is an important step forward. Quincy Public Schools is committed to engaging in this work and will be forming an Equity Work Group to undertake the work required to accomplish these tasks. This group will include representative students, parents, staff, and administrators interested in collaborating on these goals. Within the next two weeks, we will be sharing a timeline that will include short-term and long-term action steps focused on the ultimate goal of creating a safe and inclusive school community and details for how you can become involved in this Equity Work Group.

We appreciate all of the students, parents, staff, and community members who shared their experiences, ideas, and suggestions with us and we look forward to continuing the conversation. Future newsletters will highlight this important work as we make positive change together as a community.

YOUR ENERGY BILLS ARE GOING UP THIS WINTER HERE'S WHAT YOU CAN



Due to the pandemic and high natural gas prices worldwide, electricity and gas supply prices are set to be very high this winter. New and expanded assistance programs are available to help customers pay bills or manage the increase.

YOUR UTILITY COMPANY CAN HELP

If you are behind on your utility bills, you should call your utility company immediately and ask about their payment plans. Utilities are offering several customer assistance programs, including flexible payment plans (regardless of income) and balance forgiveness plans for those eligible. You will be protected from shutoff if you make payments as scheduled under the plan.

INCOME-ELIGIBLE ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Don't wait to apply for income-eligible assistance programs. First, contact your utility to apply for an income-eligible rate which provides a discount on your whole bill. Second, you may qualify for the federal Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). LIHEAP eligibility is evaluated based on your gross household income for the past 4 weeks. Use the contact info below to find your local community action agency where you can apply for LIHEAP.

HELP FOR RENTERS

Renters struggling to afford rent and utility costs may qualify for Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP). Renters experiencing financial hardship because of COVID-19 should ask if they are eligible through one of six regional housing agencies.

COMPETITIVE ELECTRIC SUPPLIERS

A study by the AG's Office found that most electric supplier customers lose money in the long run. Beware of deceptive marketing promising savings as compared to the utility's high winter electric prices. If you have a supplier, check if your rate is still competitive with your utility's. Contact the AG's Office with questions.

OTHER ASSISTANCE

If you don't qualify for income-based assistance, there may also be funds available to assist you. If your household income is between 60 to 80 percent of the state median income, you may be able to receive help from the Good Neighbor Energy Fund.

SHUTOFF MORATORIUM

From November 15 to March 15, there is a moratorium in place that prevents shutting off your gas or electric if you use that to heat your home. But know that you will still owe payment for your bills. To avoid falling into debt, take advantage of fuel assistance programs or enroll in a budgetinstallment plan.

Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes:

Our notification provider, SchoolMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers. If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.
